Rutgers Scarlet Service in Washington, DC (RSS-DC) 2026 Application

This is the application for Rutgers Scarlet Service in Washington DC (RSS-DC) Summer 2026. RSS-DC offers qualified Rutgers sophomores and juniors from Rutgers-Camden, Newark, and New Brunswick of all majors the opportunity to live, work, and learn in DC, the epicenter of American government, politics, and public leadership. Students will intern for a minimum of 150 hours over the summer at a government or non-profit office. RSS-DC students will be provided complimentary housing, a \$3,800 stipend, internship placement support, and a three-credit course free of charge. You can read more here: rssdc.rutgers.edu. Current sophomores and juniors with a 3.0 minimum GPA are eligible to apply.

You may also be interested in the Rutgers Scarlet Service Internship (RSSI) Program. RSSI provides Rutgers sophomores and juniors from Rutgers-Camden, Newark, and New Brunswick with an opportunity to earn up to \$5,000 while interning for a minimum of 150 hours over 10-12 weeks during the summer at a public service non-profit organization or direct-service government office. Students also participate in a three-credit concurrent virtual, asynchronous internship course designed to explore and engage with the topic of public service while building their career readiness and professionalism skills. You can read more here: careers.rutgers.edu/rssi. Current sophomores and juniors with a 2.5 minimum GPA (61-91 credits by end of Spring 2026) are eligible to apply for RSSI.


